Twenty-seven advanced, ski ready souls made their way to Schweitzer Mountain in Idaho on February 4th. Twenty-three of us road the shuttle from Spokane, Washington to the resort while four others met us at our home for the week, the Selkirk Lodge, which was located in the heart of the resort village. We arrived on time and checked into our rooms without a problem. Once we were unpacked and a few people explored the shops in the village, we met at the Welcome Party that evening. Our event included another ski group from Tampa, Florida which was unusual yet refreshing. No party would be complete without an Idaho potato! We had baked pota-

snow was compacted. We all agreed to stay out of the trees!




