August 12th will be our next general meeting so mark your calendar for the event. We will have



PRICING: FULL packages include air, all transfers, and per person lodging based on double-occupancy. LAND packages do not include air. Ground transportation will be included and available on selected trips for land package participants if they can meet the group at the destination airport on time. Ground transportation will not be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group. Published prices do not include baggage fees, equipment rentals or lift tickets, and are subject to change. The number in parentheses is the price for the trip if you pay by check. WHY IS THERE A TRAIN IN MINUTE MAID PARK?

The largest entrance to the park is inside what was once Houston's Union Station, and the leftfield side of the stadium features a railway as homage to the site's
history. The train moves
along a track on top of the
length of the exterior wall
beyond left field whenever
an Astros player hits a
home run, and/or when

replica of a 19th century locomotive (circa 1860) and its coal tender became a fast fan favorite in the inaugural season. It also proves a link to the past for Houston and the Union Station site. Weighing

A concourse above Tal's Hill features the "Conoco Home Run Porch" in left-center field that is actually over the field of play, and features a classic gasoline pump that displays the total number of Astros home runs hit since the park opened.
