SNOWMASS 2005

The day started out as a normal day to head out of town for skiing. Boy, were we wrong about that. We had 3 flights out of Houston to Denver to connect with 6 flights to Aspen. Only one lucky group made it to Aspen, which included Susan Blome, Tom Dwyer, Leyla Ozkardesh, and David Sechler. The infamous trip leader, Bill Bomberger, was told by United Airlines that a second flight had also landed with 9 others. We did not have enough people to charter a bus on our own, so we connected with the Austin Skiers to make it economical. Right after we chartered the bus, one of the 9 passengers that United said was in Aspen reappeared at the airport. Now was the time to be creative. We ended up renting 2 cars at the airport to move the 4 that we did not have room for. Gary Ladd volunteered for this opportunity. About this time we found 3 more Texas ski council skiers stranded at the airport with us! Charles Butler now volunteered to drive the second vehicle to Snowmass. After becoming expert jugglers, we finally made it on the road around 8 p.m. As the bus was going up the last hill into Snowmass, a car in front of the bus decided to slow down. We lost all of our momentum and were stuck on the ice. The nice Snowmass police department arrived and immediately (after rushing off to a bar fight) called for a front end loader to pull us up the last hill into Snowmass. We arrived at the hotel around 1 a.m.

Sunday morning. It was the best of times and the worst of times. The trip leader used up all of his bad snowday IOU's for this trip. We had 6-8" of powder each day for the first 5 days of the trip. The advanced skiers loved it, but the lower level skiers had their work cut out for them.

Tuesday, the participants on the short trip also experienced trying travel. They arrived at the Houston airport to learn that the flight from Denver to Aspen had been cancelled. Our wholesaler was wonderful and we had a bus 30 minutes after we landed in Denver. It had been snowing for days and the airport was closed repeatedly. But, our intrepid group caught the bus except for Kay McKeough, whose flight to Aspen had not been cancelled. By the time we had driven across Denver and stopped for another bus with a defroster, we learned that Kay's plane sat on the runway in Denver and returned to the airport without taking off. She hopped in a cab and met us at Applejacks. So began the long journey into the dark snowy night and we arrived in Snowmass only to learn that the bus could not make it up the final hill due to icy conditions – not again! Much as the driver tried, it wasn't going to happen. By then, it was 3 a.m. and there was no way to get to our lodging. Except for the fine young man who worked at The Stonebridge who came down the hill in his own truck and ferried us up there 3 or 4 at a time. Bless his soul. The rest of the Stonebridge crew unloaded our bags from the bus and delivered them to our rooms later that morning. Of course, **Kay's** skis and luggage remained in Denver for the next couple of days. Luckily she had **Nancy Neill** for a roommate. **Nancy**, you've got some really cute clothes!

In spite of the lateness of our arrival, Barbara Ehrlich, C. J. Kao, Camille LaRoe, Ann Rogers, K. C. Wang, Bessy Wang, Dave Whitehead, Pat Piech, Robbin Anderson, June Cullum and several more skiers braved the slopes that first day. It continued to snow most of that day and evening. By Wednesday, heavy snow and wind caused periodic whiteouts, giving Margaret Clingerman the opportunity to lead Ron and Roberta Rambin, Gary Hercules, Gary Ladd, and Philip Vice down the 'invisible mountain'. That day, Richard Payne had all of the excitement. Richard was skiing with Janet McKenzie and Bob Wray and was not paying attention (showing off) when he hit some soft snow and was taken off the trail, not to be seen for a while. After several minutes all Janet could say was, "a ski was seen flying out of the woods on to the trail, then another ski, a ski pole, and a second ski pole appeared. Richard finally climbed out of the tree well that he fell into. His skis were at the bottom of the trail with him still in them."

Thursday dawned clear and bright with gorgeous snow everywhere and the skiing was terrific. Nancy DuFrane and Ashok Moza were seen all over the slopes as were Rob and Vickie Degeyter along with their old friends, Sharon and Gary Sequeira. This was the Degeyters' first trip with the club and, according to them, won't be their last. Bill Bomberger, Keith Kirkman, Bob Debell, and Frank Adams did not need anymore exercise after their exploits. They found the longest trail at Snowmass, which was a double black and made an attempt to get down the run. At the top of the trail there were only two tracks in the knee deep powder, unfortunately it was heavy powder. A stop every hundred yards was mandatory with the skiers in agony from the exercise. All made it to the bottom.



FROM THE SKI DESK



If you attended the May meeting or recent Happy Hours, you've already seen flyers for some of next year's ski trips. At the time this article is being written, we are still firming up contracts and working on what the prices will be. In many cases, the lodging will be ski-in, ski-out. It will be a GREAT year.

In this issue, there are several articles you need to look at. The tentative Ski

Trip Schedule is published. And the REALLY BIG NEWS – we will be allowing trip signup ONLINE by CREDIT CARD. Read the article "Pay for your ski trip by credit card" for more information.

Full trip details, prices and trip sign-up instructions will be published in the August Sitzmarke. REMEMBER, in order to sign up for a trip, you must be a member in good standing. Since memberships and renewals are processed EARLY in the month, make sure your membership application and dues are in by August 1. Don't forget -- renewals can be done online.

As promised in earlier Sitzmarkes, we are offering FIVE short trips: Keystone, Vail Short, Steamboat Short, Kelowna, and one TBA. Keystone and Steamboat will leave around 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday and return on Sunday. These two trips give you 4 ski days for 3 vacation days and 5 hotel nights. Vail will leave on Saturday and return late on Wednesday, allowing you to ski the day of departure and giving you 4 ski days for 3 vacation days and 4 hotel nights. The TBA trip will probably leave around 5:30 p.m. on Thursday and return late on Monday, giving you 4 ski days for 2 vacation days and 4 hotel nights.

Kelowna leaves on Wednesday and returns on Sunday. It could also be called Big White Short, but since we are not staying at Big White at all, I thought it more appropriate to call it Kelowna, the town we will be staying in. Note: the Big White trip will stay at Big White 4 nights and 3 nights in Kelowna. The short trip will stay in Kelowna 4 nights. For the Kelowna trip, skiing is available on Thursday and Friday and wine tasting is available every day. This trip is planned for the wine enthusiast or the wine enthusiast who would also like to ski some. Since Kelowna is a town of 100,000, there is also plenty of shopping and museums as well.

For those of you who wish to take a full week off – we have some great trips available. We are pleased to offer a combination of old favorites and some new and interesting locations as well: Vail in December; Steamboat and Mammoth in January; Aspen and Big White/Kelowna, British Columbia in February; Snowbird, Utah in February/March; and Big Mountain in March. And don't forget an incredible overseas trip in February/March to Finland/Stockholm.

PAY FOR YOUR SKI TRIP BY CREDIT CARD

The SCSC Board of Directors (Board) is pleased to announce that for the 2005-2006 ski season you can sign up for trips online and pay for the trip with a credit card utilizing PayPal.

You may have seen the article in the May Sitzmarke that you can renew your membership online the same way. As that article stated, "By using PayPal, no one within SCSC will ever see or know a member's credit card information."

Note, the only way to pay by credit card is online. No TC, ATC or officer will be able to process a credit card directly.

To use this feature, you must have a Username and Password set up. If you do not have this set up yet, it is recommended you do so NOW to avoid delay:

- 1. Go to www.spacecityskiclub.org.
- 2. Click on "My SCSC."
- 3. Click on "SCSC members may request an account here."
- 4. Fill out the information as requested. NOTE you will need your member number. It is on the label of your Sitzmarke.
- 5. The username and password will be emailed to the email address the membership chairman has on file. If the email is incorrect, contact Jeannine Jiral: Jeannine@ev1.net.

A brief overview of how the process will work is as follows:

• Trip signup will begin August 13. This will NOT be limited to

mail-in signup but will also include online signup and even registration forms and checks given to the TC. (Must be given to the TC, not the ATC or anyone else. However, a member may sign up another member at the same time, as in the past.)

- Trip signup will begin on that date and will NOT end at a date and restart at the September meeting. Once trip signup begins, it will continue.
- When you signup for a trip online, you can elect to pay the deposit only (\$150 for domestic trips, \$300 for overseas trips) or you can elect to pay for the ENTIRE trip at that time.
- If you pay only the deposit when signing up for the trip, you can make the final payment online or by giving a check to the TC, regardless of whether you paid the deposit online or not. In other words it is your choice how you pay each part of the trip (deposit and final payment) -- by credit card (online) or by check.
- At this time, we do not intend to accept credit card payments for optional items on the trip such as lift tickets and optional activities.

Many members have asked to use credit cards for payment of trips because of the 'perks' they receive for credit card usage. However, there is a cost to the club associated with PayPal and a nominal fee is added to the cost of the trip.



Any child under 18 years of age can stay free in lodging unit with one paid adult. 
