

Happy New Year! The holidays are now behind us and ski season should be switching into full gear. Unfortunately, we got off to "rocky" (no pun intended start with the cancellation of the Snowbird trip and the switch to Red River and the man-made stuff last month. I think a word or two on cancellation policy is apropos at this time.

Please be advised that the TSC trips are the only trips that have a "no snow" clauses in their contract. Club trips have no built-in outs for lack of snow. The TSC "no snow" clause must be invoked by the TSC and applies only to lodging and lift tickets. It goes without saying that the airlines do their own thing and could care less if you ski or not. All the Snowbird trip participants will get a refund when SCSC gets our refund from our vendors. I assure you that we are hard at work to get you as much of your money back as possible however there will be some cancellation penalties and non-refundable expense. Please be patient.

As far as SCSC cancellation policies go, there is **NO REFUND FOR CANCELLATION AFTER FINAL PAYMENT UNLESS WE CAN REPLACE YOU ON THE TRIP.** The same goes for transfers. The trip participant who wants to cancel must notify the trip leader in writing. If a replacement is found, the trip cost less a \$30.00 cancellation fee and any name change fee charged by the airline if the ticket has already been issued will be refunded.

The trip leaders will do everything in their power to help find a replacement but members need to keep in mind that they are hard-working volunteers and not your personal travel agent. If you absolutely must cancel please try to be proactive in finding your own replacement. Here are a few helpful hints:

- 1. Pick up the phone and call other trip participants to see if they have a friend who might want to take your place on the trip
- 2. Contact John Rice for a list of new members who might have joined too late to get on the trip but who might still want to go.
- 3. Contact Gary Butler to get the news out on the club web/email that there is a trip opening for sale.
- 4. Remember that after final payment the trip is yours to sell at a discount if you wish to cut your losses

Believe me, nobody wants it to snow as badly as Kathy Young does. I truly wish I could fix it. Too bad, I am not Mother Nature and neither are the trip leaders. In fact, I assure you that my trip leaders and I are even more bummed out and disappointed at the lack of snow than you are. After all the months of hard work and planning we are not very happy at this point. On a positive note, the situation just has to get better. Those of you who missed out on the white stuff earlier in the season may want to take a look as some of the late season trips that still have openings. Just wait. Stay optimistic and just repeat over and over, LET IT SNOW, LET IT SNOW.

# **Snowboard Tips**

It is no longer a novelty to find SCSC members riding their boards down the slopes of their favorite mountain. The popularity of the sport has extended beyond the teen years, and the average age of boarders has increased annually. Each year a new crop of SCSCrs announce that "this is the year" they plan to give it a try. This article is for those individuals.

A few years back on the club's first trip to Mammoth, I decided that since I wasn't getting any younger, I would test my fortitude. My spirit was willing - I just didn't know if my body would be up to the challenge. Well, it was a close call, but now I have a great time on both my board and skis. My real challenge now is hauling all the stuff needed to do both on trips, but that is another story. Anyway, "listen-up" you first timers, because this advice will help you get the best start.

<u>Tip # 1.</u> Packages Deals. Many areas have package deals for beginners which include free lift tickets and low rental prices if you take beginner lessons. So before you rent equipment and buy lift tickets, check out your options. This could save you some bucks.

Tip # 2. Equipment & Clothing. Most of the rental shops do carry boards. However, you might want to look for specialty board shops. They usually have more equipment and know more specifics about boarding. Besides, it is an experience to hang out there and pretend you fit in with the crowd. Boards are like skis -different makes, shapes, bindings, etc. They will fit you mostly by experience and height. Step-in bindings are great - and I would recommend you get them if they are available. You will be asked if you are regular or "goofy." A regular boarder puts their left foot in front - goofy puts their right. If you slalom water ski - whichever foot you place in front - do the same on a board. If you don't know, try this simple test. Standing still feet together - have someone push you (gently) from behind. Whichever foot you place in front to maintain your balance – put that foot in front on a board. Most snowboard clothing is reinforced around the knees and elbows. Don't wear your "pretty" stuff because you might tear it. Boarders have to rest sitting down, so be sure to have waterproof on your rear.

Tip # 3. Body Protection. Knees, wrists and rears take a beating – especially at first. My instructor warned me to use kneepads – and actually lent me a pair. However, most areas do not have these readily available. You will be forever grateful to me (buy me a drink) if you take along your roller blading guards – knees, wrists, rear, etc. or buy some before you go and wear them! Wrist injuries are the most common occurrence – and I have actually snapped the plastic guard in one of my wristbands. I talked to a distraught mother whose daughter broke her wrist the first time out – after taking a lesson – and no one warned them to wear guards – so be smart and protect yourself. Knees have to take a lot of hits, and you will avoid bruising with your kneepads. Several brands of snowboard pants have built-in

kneepads. Also, I believe helmets will become standard equipment for both boarders and skiers, so I would think about using a helmet also.

Tip #4. Snow Conditions. If the snow isn't good enough to ski on – don't decide to try boarding instead. You want to learn on soft, fluffy snow for two reasons: you can control the board a lot better, and hard pack and ice do not feel good on the body.

Tip # 5. Lessons. Take a lesson. Instructors will tell you that youngsters learn boarding a whole lot faster than skiing; however, even the best athletics will tell you learning to board ain't a piece of cake. I had a great young woman instructor who patiently helped me down the slopes (she boarded backwards in front of me - holding my hands to control my speed which allowed me to practice weight shifts). I was glad to learn I was not the oldest person she had taught. Her Dad, who was in his sixties, had just taken lessons from her so she understood I did not grow up with the skateboard—and had to learn the movements from scratch. Anyway, you will save yourself and your body a lot of time and discomfort by taking a lesson or two. I knew I had arrived when a young kid asked me for pointers. Brave kid—intermediate slope—no clue. I watched him spend the day trying to figure it out the painful way.

Tip # 6. Safety on the Slopes. Give yourself and all new boarders plenty of room to traverse the mountain. I have been skiing since I was a kid, and for the first time in a lot of years, downloading was scary and beginner slopes looked steep. Stay in a green area and learn how to get off the lifts without knocking everybody down. Also know you have a blind area – that area to your back – so be extra careful not to turn directly into another boarder or skier.

Clip this article and put it with your snow gear. Snowboarding is a lot of fun – and once you get the basics, you will be glad you decided to take the plunge. The best part is the nine months out of the year you can tell the younger set that you snowboard. For some reason – that gets their attention and you get respect!
