Thanks "you all" kickers for a great time!











Mail-in Sign-up: HERE IT IS!!! Your chance to get an early berth on your favorite SCSC ski trip(s) for 1994-1995. The mail-in sign-up form is in this issue of the Sitzmarke, so copy it or clip it out and follow the instructions below. Then, come by the September meeting at The Grand to verify your registration and pick up additional information the TC will have for you.

1. Mail-in sign-up begins on Monday, August 15 and ends on Saturday, August 27. Your sign-up envelope must be postmarked on or between these dates. (Registrations received with postmarks

outside these dates will be held until the September general meeting. If you visit the trip table you may be added to the trip at that time, space permitting.)

2. You must be a current member in good standing. In general, this means you should have renewed your membership prior to August 1 (as explained in July's From the Ski Desk...). Your 1994-95 membership number should be shown on the mailing label for the August Sitzmarke. Call your VP of Membership, Mel Tawney, if you have questions.

 You may sign up yourself and one other SCSC member per trip (or family member for the Family Optional trip -- see By-Law 2.8. A in your club directory).

4. In the registration envelope include the trip registration form and your deposit. The deposit for the Interlaken trip is \$300 per participant. The deposit on all other trips is \$100 per participant. Checks should be made payable to "SCSC" and should have your membership number and the trip name listed on the check.

5. **Mail your registration to the Trip Coordinator** for the trip on which you wish to participate. TC names and addresses for all trips are listed in this Sitzmarke. If your registration is mailed to anyone other than the TC, it will be returned to you and you will not be registered for the trip.

6. If the postmark is correct and the registration meets the above guidelines, names will be added to each trip's Participant List in the order received. If a trip's participant roster fills during mail-in sign-up, additional registrations received will be added to a trip Wait List in the order received. Checks for wait-listed members will be held by the TC until a space becomes available on the trip. Participants' checks will be deposited on or after August 31st.

 These procedures apply to ALL members (except the trip's TC and ATC) and all Trip Participants are subject to SCSC Standing Rules, Policies, and Procedures.

8. SCSC is not responsible for any problems with the U.S. Postal Service, including delayed delivery or lost mail.

9. Information shown on the Trip Schedule is subject to change. Contact the TC or ATC for up-to-date info.

10. Any registrations received which do not meet the above qualifications may be returned to the sender

Land Packages: For those of you having lots of frequent flyer miles or other means of reaching the destination airport or resort, the Executive Committee has approved a limited trial of land packages for this year's trips. This should add some extra value to your SCSC membership and allow some of you to get in one more trip for the ski season. The Keystone, Vail, Whistler, and Mt. Bachelor trips will offer two prices on their trips, one with air and one without. For these trips only, you will need to indicate on your mail-in registration whether you are signing up for the full package or the land package.

Because of the restrictions noted below for the land package, be sure you have concrete travel arrangements made before you sign up for one of these. SCSC will not be responsible for any difficulties or extra expense you incur due to delayed or cancelled flights or other transportation problems.

Rules and restrictions for land packages:

* The price of the land package will be the full trip price minus airfare. Ground transportation will be included and will be available to land package participants if they can meet the group at the destination airport on time. Ground transportation will not be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group.

Other than the full package, this is the only package price available; no other combinations of lodging and/or transportation will be offered. (Note: As in the past, members may still arrange their own transportation, lodging, etc., and pay only for the parties and trip options. If so, please arrange to do this in advance, as at the pre-trip party.)

* Normal cancellation & transfer policies apply -- with the added stipulation that, on or after final payment date, land package participants must be replaced from a land package wait list and full package participants must be replaced from a full package wait list in order to transfer or receive a refund.

* It will not be possible to convert your trip from land package to full package, or vice versa, after final payment date.

Airline commitments can not be changed by the club after that date.

* If you sign-up for a land package, please notify the TC of your transportation plans in advance of the trip. The TC can then tell you where to meet the group or other pertinent information.





The first QUARTERLY DELEGATES MEETING of the TSC's 1994-95 season was held June 11th at the Embassy Suites in Dallas, with all Clubs represented except San Antonio Ski Club. TSC PRESIDENT (and SCSC'sown) JERRY MONTGOMERY kickedoff the "New Year" by addressing several TSC policies, including the good news that all TSC Clubs are now in good standing.

PAST PRESIDENT RHONDA McGREE distributed new TSC manuals which contain pertinent data such as the 1994-95 TSC Calendar, TSC Officer & Club Rosters, Trip Updates, TSC Bylaws, Standing Rules, Race Rules, Fam Trip Policy, etc.

During the meeting, Delegates were asked to approve the purchase of a licensed word processing program and upgraded printer memory for the Secretary and a (long overdue) fax machine for the VP of Marketing. After discussing the need for these items, they were unanimously approved.

Tom Abbott of Adventure Tours in Dallas gave, a presentation concerning the potential value and pros & cons of using charter flights for group travel.

The Annual Bid Meeting was announced as being set for April 7 thru 9, 1995 at the infamous Bid Meeting "stomping grounds", the Holiday Inn Riverwalk in San Antonio. The Pre-Select Committee for the 1995-96 Ski Tripswill be chaired by MARKETING VPBILL SNEED and will include one member from each of Texas Ski Rangers, Clear Lake Area Ski Club, San Antonio Ski Club, Texas Twisters, and two appointed members-at-large. Confidentiality of TSC Bids was stressed with the reminder that bids are for use only by the TSC, its Clubs, and the bidding ski area.


Other committee appointments for 1994-95 included AUDIT COMMITTEE -- Wanda Jamison of Clear Lake as Chair and SCSC's Ray Naudain; SPONSORSHIP/INTER-COUNCIL -- Don Thomas of San Antonio Ski Club; and RACE COMMITTEE -- (yes, SCSC strikes again) with Ted Bergeron being appointed a second term as Chair, Rollo Gurss of Texas Twisters in Year #2 as Advisor, and new members Pat Halpin of Los Amigos and Rachel Jackson of Capital Downhill. Future committee appointments will be announced at a later date.

MARKETING VPBILL SNEED reported that familiarization trips are under negotiation for Telluride, Taos, and Mammoth Mountain, and Bill will also be talking with Big Mountain resort in Montana.

The VPs OF TRIPS for 1994-95 are *full speed ahead* with site inspections and planning meetings already scheduled. Participant numbers are currently anticipated to be 426 on FALL ROUNDUP to **KEYSTONE**, 801 on TRADITIONAL to **VAIL**, 477 on WINTER SHOOTOUT to **WHISTLER**, **B.C.**, 218 on EXPEDITION to **SWITZERLAND**, and 400 on FINAL SHOWDOWN to **MT**. **BACHELOR**. Updates will be sent to Club Trip Leaders as plans progress.

1994 TSC Summer Events include(d) the June 24-26 Summer Meltdown in Port Aransas, the July 9th Club Training Meeting in Dallas (on which yours truly is a committee member), and the next Quarterly Delegates Meeting in Austin on 8/20.




Blaise Guerrero -**Beaver Creek**

George Flourney -Aspen



Robert Reichek -Interlaken




Eric Prentis -Steamboat
