

highlighted in bold as follows:

A participant may forfeit their full deposit if they fail to notify the Club in writing of their intent to withdraw on or before the published final payment dates. A minimum of \$30.00 or 20% of the published trip cost, whichever is less, said amount not to be less than \$10.00 will be assessed for each trip cancellation.

This change was made so as not to overly penalize participants forced to cancel inexpensive overnight activities. If you are interested in the SCSC organization and who does what, read the By-laws and the Standing Rules in the front of the directory.





Good Advice: "You can't go there this time of year." "Always too cold there" It's too warm for good skiing." "The snow's too wet, kinda slushy." "The resorts back east are too icy." "The snow's too dry and too deep. It's hard to ski that stuff." "Too crowded and too expensive" "Nothing to do there."

Sound Familiar? Like most of us, you probably rely on some word of mouth to help you decide where to spend that hard-earned money on a ski vacation. In a ski club, with many others of like interests, you're

sure you'll get the straight poop. Unfortunately, that is only partly true...

If I'm lyin", I'm Dyin': I don't mean to imply that your fellow members are lying to you. It's just that, many times, stated opinions about an area are based on just one trip to the area, or someone else's comments, and are always colored by the teller's own likes, dislikes and preferences. From a sincere desire to help can often come generalizations (see paragraph 1) that don't tell the whole story about an area.

Luck of the Draw: As an early example or two: Though some might say it's too warm or that snow is too unreliable in November or early December for good skiing, last year's Thanksgiving trip participants in Breckenridge were on good snow, but fighting off frostbite. "Icy" Maine drew only a few participants

a couple of years ago, but they probably had the best skiing experience of that season. Yes, last year's trip to Banff was pretty cold, but weeks before averaged 30 or more degrees warmer. Yes, SCSC's last trip to Mt. Bachelor had people skiing as much in rain as snow. But this resort is an official training center for the US Ski Team (who members don't go there for the wet stuff) and it is rated by others who've been there as one of the best resorts they've ever skied, ever. For those who've not noticed, the weather is unpredictable!

Eeny, Meeny, Moe? So, what to do--throw a dart?!? No, just follow a few guidelines: Do listen to the opinions of your fellow members and friends -- but carry a salt shaker and take any generalizations you hear with a grain or two. Read the annual reviews and statistics in Skiing, Ski or Snow Country magazines (usually Sept/Oct issues). Get brochures from the resorts or from our trip leaders. Find something that meets your needs. Keep your mind open; listen to the facts; be your own judge; be adventurous, take the road less travelled; and in the end, go with your heart.

If none of this works for you, give me or one of the DOTs a call -- we can always suggest an exciting trip with an open slot or two. If Not, I'll throw the dart for you!

Postscript: Now that your mind is open, take a fresh look at this year's schedule. There just might still be room on an early trip (Keystone, Crested Butte or Beaver Creek) or one of the not-your-same-old destinations (Angel Fire, Mammoth/Reno) or even one of your favorites. Go ahead, you really can't lose.







"The only persons eligible to hold office shall be those who have been members in good standing for the twelve months preceding the annual meeting (March). Additionally, candidates for the President shall have been or are currently an elected officer of the Executive Committee."

This includes YOU!! If you have always wondered why SCSC does the things it does or that maybe, just maybe, YOU could do it better, now's your chance to make a significant contribution to YOUR club. The following briefly describes the basic responsibilities of each officer:


TERRY'S TIDBITS






