We're off to a good start, as the Breckenridge trip returned with the 1st place trophy for racing. Out of the 56 trip participants, we had 45 racers, 21 medal winners, and accrued 1232 points. Additionally, there were three outstanding individual racers (see Ted Bergeron's article for all the details).

Regardless of medals, points or whatever, we appreciated every racer's efforts. Your participation and enthusiasm were great! Hopefully, the excellent early snow will continue; all of our trips will go off without a hitch; and our racing mania will continue in Winter Park, Crested Butte and Heavenly.

This year's Executive Committee has now completed over half of our year's work. At the beginning of the year, we set forth a list of goals which we hoped to accomplish. I am happy to inform you that we are moving right along toward the realization of those goals. Our membership is at the highest it has been in many years; as of early December, we had 1330 members. Ed Cain, V.P. Membership, and his team of volunteers have done an excellent job of recruiting and signing up new members. Our commitment to racing has been demonstrated largely through the efforts of Ted Bergeron, Racing Director, with an organized program, a race director's manual and training sessions. The Nominating Committee has produced an excellent set of guidelines for the annual task of searching for officer nominees. This is a document which can be built upon and utilized from year to year. A committee is compiling an officers' manual, which can be a reference each year for the new incoming officers. These are just a few of our accomplishments, in addition to those routine jobs which each of the offices entail. For the remainder of the year, we hope to continue to offer programs and activities which are of interest to our members. Also, we hope to increase our community efforts with some involvement in charitable activities (more to come on that, later).

At our January meeting, we will have a short program on rollerblading, which is excellent conditioning for skiing. Then on January 25, we can have a chance to try this fun sport. Look for details in this issue. Please note that our January meeting (January 20,) is later than usual due to participation in Texas Ski Week in Winter Park. Happy Hour will be January 30, at Dave & Buster's. See you there, or maybe on the rollerblades!!!

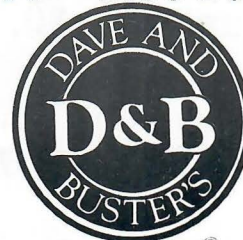

FROM THE SKI DESK

I had the great pleasure of being a participant on the first trip of the season, the TSC FALL ROUNDUP AT BRECKENRIDGE during Thanksgiving, where the ski area reported the best snow at Thanksgiving in 17 years and the best overall conditions in 6 years! Be sure to read ATC JoANN LANE's trip article that should appear in this Sitzmarke, as well as SCSC Race Director TED BERGERON's "TSC Challenge Series Update" that will recap all the fantastic race results that Breckenridge trip participants are boasting about!



While most all of you recognize the indispensable roles that our TCs and ATCs play for Space City, are you aware of the vital function of TSC Trip Race Directors in ensuring that our participation in the TSC Challenge Races is as effective as possible? These "unsung heros" are responsible for obtaining information from each club member, submitting it in proper form to the TSC Vice President well in advance of the actual trip, motivating and having each potential race participant complete NASTAR cards that must be turned in at the resort before the race, attending the Resort Race Director Meeting for updated rules and verifying the TSC Race Computer report on our trip participants, obtaining race bibs and making sure that everyone understands the devastating consequences of wearing one that is not specifically their own, making it to the race course on time, coaching and calming the occasional jittery nerves of anxious race participants, having to race last themselves without time for mental or physical preparation, having participants verify their race results immediately, going back to the Race Shack **immediately after the race** to validate our club statistics in order to meet the TSC requirements, then (finally!) obtaining and distributing the medal-winners' pins !!!

After the Snowmass races last season demonstrated that our members did not fully understand the stringent Race Rules, TED BERGERON decided to volunteer as Club Overall Race Director this year and take on the task of developing a "Certified Race Director" training program. Thanks to his diligence and hard work, SCSC now has about 25 certified race directors for our future TSC trips (be sure to see the related article in this Sitzmarke)! I hope that many of you will give a word of thanks to the "Unsung Heros" who are our eight TSC Trip Race Directors for 1991-92: TED B., Overall Director and for the TSC Fall Roundup; JEFF SARFF, JEFF LINDEN & ROGER WILLIAMS for TSC Traditional; TOM MERCER for TSC Winter Shootout; and PEGGY DONLEY, RON FLOWERS & ED KANYUCK for TSC Final Showdown.

Our Monthly Meeting has been moved to the third Monday in January (the 20th) to allow 120 of our members to return from the TSC Traditional Trip at Winter Park. We have full faith that they will be bringing back the same reports as Breckenridge did in early December! **BEST WISHES TO EVERYONE FOR A WONDERFUL NEW YEAR, AND HERE'S HOPING TO SEE YOU SOON ON THE SLOPES !!!**

SPACE CITY SKI CLUB WINS 1st PLACE IN DIVISION I

The Houston Oilers who don't seem to function well in cold, windy, snowy weather could have taken some lessons in enthusiasm and execution from the Space City Ski Club. On Friday, November 29, 1991 SCSC awakened to an unexpected sight:

Temp: 9 Degrees F.

Wind: 12 - 15 MPH

Heavy Snow

Forecast: Continued Heavy Snow

As Race Director for the Breckendridge Trip, I wasn't really thrilled by this turn of events. It is difficult enough in good weather and ideal skiing conditions to get a good turnout for Race Day, but I still had high hopes because SCSC has a lot riding on the races this year.

When I arrived at the starting area of the NASTAR course about an hour before the race, some of our members were already there. Soon they started arriving in droves, and by race time, 45 out of the total of 62 participants on our trip were eagerly awaiting to compete. When I saw that, I no longer felt the effects of the Zero Degrees wind chill factor; all I felt was the excitement and enthusiasm these racers brought with them. That's right, 73% of our trip participants took part in the TSC Fall Round-up Races this year, and we should all be so proud of the way they performed, especially in that kind of weather.

Of the 45 racers: 21 won medals
 38 won points for the club
 12 had never raced NASTAR before
 14 had run only 1 or 2 NASTAR races before

These numbers are more significant when you consider that we had a small group of experienced NASTAR racers and a large group who had little or no NASTAR experience at all. The most surprising of all were the number of racers who competed that had **NEVER** raced NASTAR. These people overcame "The Fear of The Unknown" and gave it their all for themselves and the club. Even those racers who courageously tried but came up a little short in points are a vitally important part of our group; your efforts are an inspiration to the entire club.

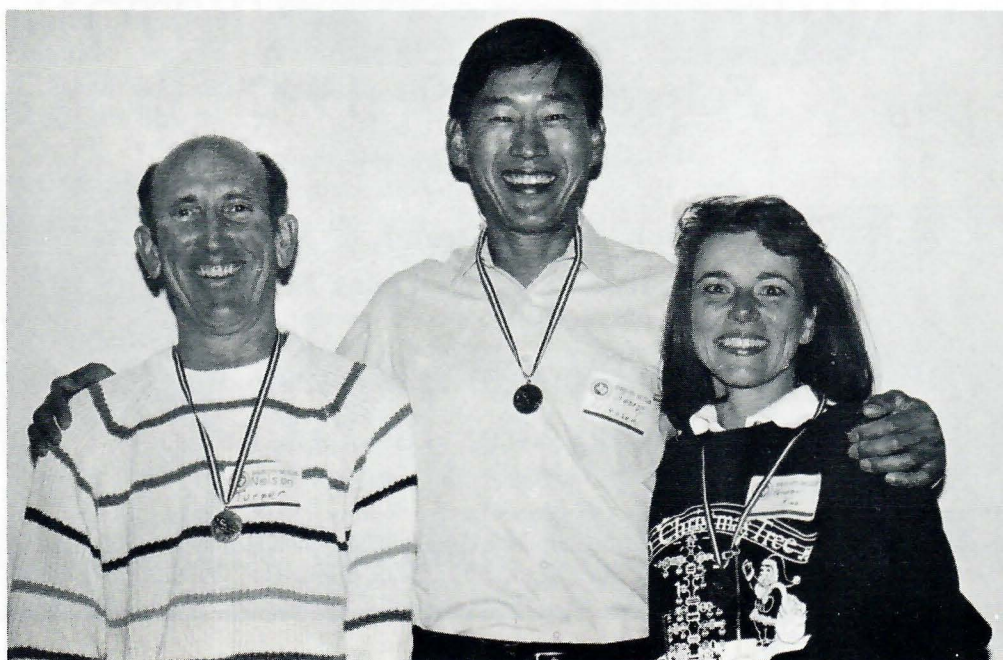

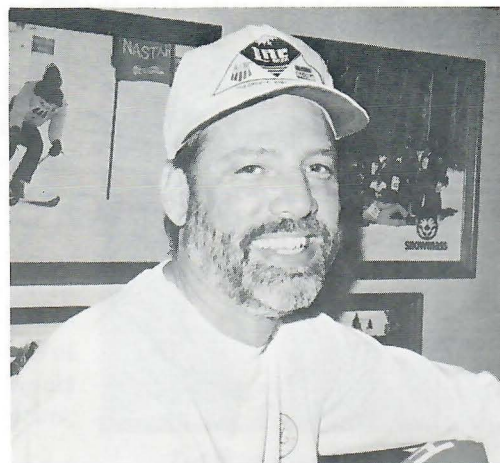


OSHMAN'S DOWNHILL

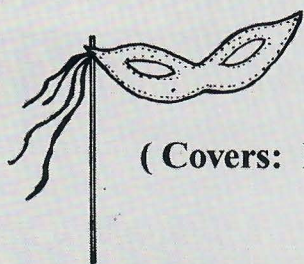

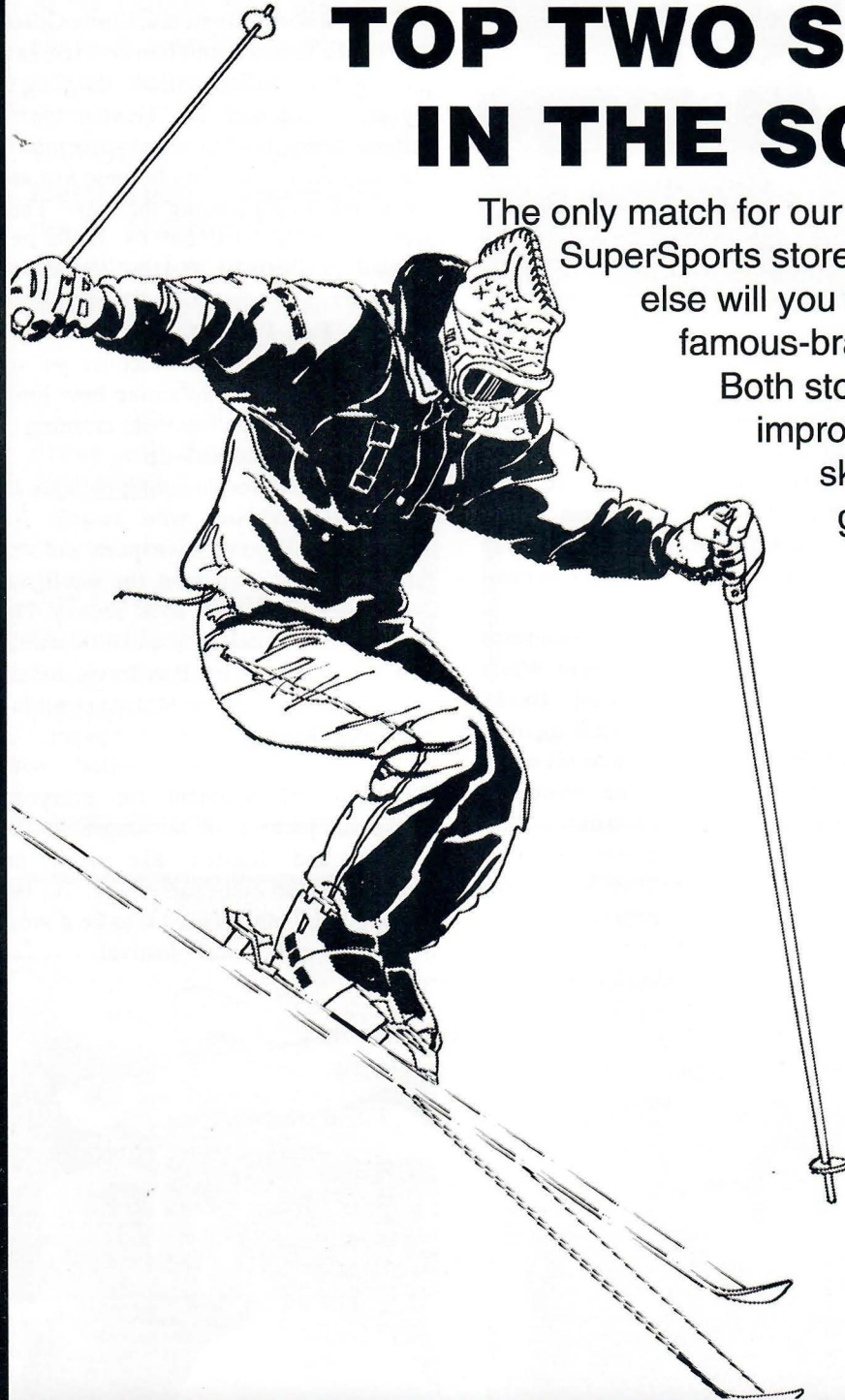

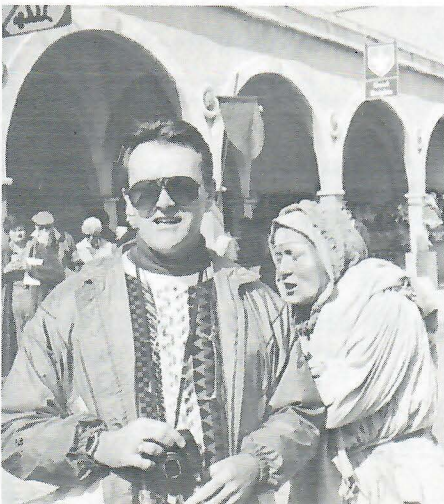
TEXAS RENAISSANCE FESTIVAL

Seen at the Belly Dancing show were Ray Davis, Denise Loos, Tom

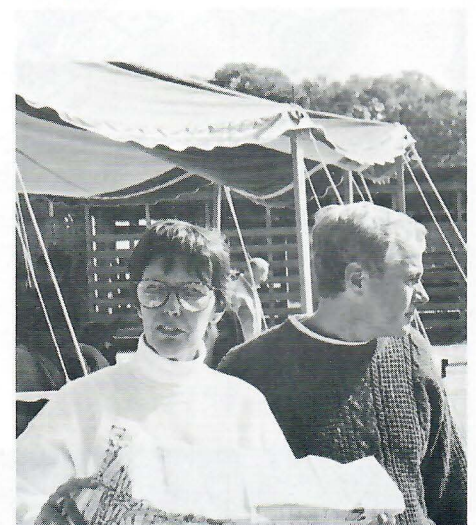

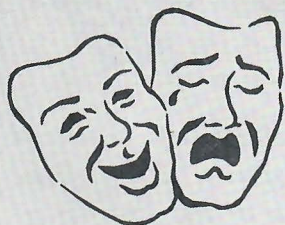

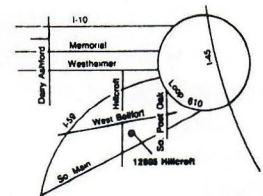

After the awards were passed out about half the group proceeded up to Luther's BBQ. We took over about a

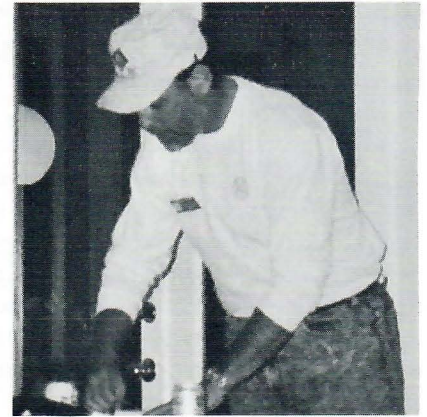


RACE DIRECTOR TRAINING
