The New NASTAR Handicap System---

Last year we retired the TSC Division I NASTAR trophy. This year not only do we start off new, but the rules have changed. There are two changes in how we will compete for the Texas Ski Cup: new club divisions and a new club racing ability handicap system.



New Club Divisions--Previously, there were three divisions based SCSC Race Director participating simply on club membership.

in '92 Follies!!

However, it was noticed that club size had nothing to do with race participation. Starting this year, there will be four divisions, based on the clubs' average number of racers from previous years, beginning with last season's data for 1991-92. So the new divisions are:

Division I	clubs averaging 100 or more racers per year
Division III	clubs averaging 25 - 49 racers per year
Division II	clubs averaging 50 - 99 racers per year
Division IV	clubs averaging less than 25 racers per year.

When we refer to average for the year, we mean a five year average. So for this year, we will use the actual number of racers who competed last year. As data on more years of racing are obtained, an average number of racers per year will emerge for each club.

The TSC race director will keep all race records for each club and at the end of each season, will determine each club's division placement for the next season based on accrued data. The major benefit to the first change is that clubs will compete only with clubs who have a similar number of racers.

#### New Club Racing Ability Handicapping System

In NASTAR racing, each person competes against a standard, determined by comparing all ski resort pros against the best in the nation that season. Well, in a similar way, the clubs will compete against each other based on each club's total skiing ability, measured by their point totals earned each season.

The best club in total points in each division is not given any handicap, like in golf or bowling handicapping, where the best is given a handicap of "0". Each competing club in the divisions are then ranked against the best club and are given a handicap percentage, just like in the concept of NASTAR racing. Only with the clubs, the percent handicap is determined by dividing their total point score into the score of the best team to obtain the maximum or final handicap for each club.

Let us use an example to illustrate this concept. In one ski season, club A scored 4,000 points and club B scored 3,000. Club B's maximum handicap is 33%, or 1.33. Every point total in each race for the 1992-93 season would be multiplied by 1.33 for club B. At a TSC race, club A scores 1,000 points and club B scores 800. Multiplying by 1.33, club B would be awarded

1,066 final points and would rank higher than club A. However, maximum handicaps would not be used in the first year of operation. Instead the club racing ablility handicapping system would be introduced gradually into TSC until five years' data were accumulated. In the first year, a partial handicap would be given to each club based on 1991-92's data for one year (70% of the full handicap). Next year, it will go up to 75%, adding 5% each year until a maximum of 95% is obtained.

Going back to the above example of clubs A and B, club B would not receive its total 1.33 handicap in the first year of the new handicapping system. Instead, it would receive 70% of its maximum or 1.23. Thus in the example given, club B's score of 800 would be multiplied by 1.23, resulting in 984 points and club A would emerge as the winner.

There are advantages of the new divisions and club ability handicapping. One is that clubs will compete in divisions more suited to their number of racers. Second, more clubs will improve their chances of winning a trophy. Simply having more racers will not be an advantage, since the club's racing ability will be used to compare performances. The net result is that the new system should promote more camaraderie between clubs and make racing more fun for everyone.

P.S. Some club members thought the new system was so complex that you needed a Ph. D. to understand it. Now I know

why I was chosen to be the Club Race Director, since I have one of those degrees!! But the real question is, do you understand my explanation of the system!?!?



# THE POSITION OF TEXAS SKI COUNCIL REPRSENTATIVE

Editor's note: The following is an article to provide you with further information on another volunteer opportunity with SCSC!!

Of the many offices and positions I've held over the years for Space City, this is by far one of the most important and the most fun. The TSC Representative is nominated and approved by the Board of Directors and reports to the Executive Committee. The TSC Rep keeps our officers aware of all Council business and at the direction of the Executive Committee presents SCSC's position on all Council issues at the TSC meetings.

The Texas Ski Council currently has twenty member clubs from across the state. The Council holds four meetings a year to discuss the various issues that come up throughout the year. Each club has a representative to speak for them at these meetings.


Discussions can be quite interesting at times given the differing sizes of the member clubs (Space City is the largest with 1400 members, and the smallest clubs have 50 members), the different locations across the state and the different financial structure of the member clubs (profit versus non-profit). As you might imagine, these and other factors give every club a little different perspective (sometimes a very different perspective) on what they feel is best for the Council.

There are many sensitive issues that come before the Council such as by-law changes that cover everything from membership qualifications (not meeting these qualifications can land a club on probation) to the number of votes each club has. Over the years the Race Rules probably win the prize for being the hottest topic of debate. Fortunately the financial position of the Council has stabilized in the last couple of years.

There are also a number of marketing issues that come before the Council and we often have vendors come to the meetings to present information on their resort. This can be very valuable information for Space City as we run the most extensive trip schedule of any club in the Council. The marketing efforts of the Council really culminate at the Bid Meeting held every year in April. This is the most important meeting for the Council as the Council decides which resorts will host TSC trips for the next year, and the Council also elects their officers for the next year.

While Space City does not have a By-Law or Standing Rule that spells out the qualifications for the TSC Rep position, I can't emphasize enough the importance of having served as an officer in our Club before serving as its Representative. Having been through many SCSC meetings where we review financial matters, or labor through discussions on policy that result in By-Law or Standing Rule changes, or review the status of our trips and activities, or determine membership status, or a myriad of other topics that come before the Executive Committee, provides an excellent foundation for serving in this position. In presenting our Club's opinion at the Council, you must choose your words carefully as we have been a well-respected member of the Council since its inception. And, hopefully, our Rep can pleasingly persuade other clubs to follow our lead.

As for the fun part of this job, it's a great way to meet a lot of the other volunteers from across the state that make the Texas Ski Council the great organization that it is. It's a wonderful feeling to participate on Council trips and know so many people from the other clubs, and to know that you've made a difference. **THINK ABOUT IT! VOLUNTEER!** 





# **TSC REPORT**

SCSC's 1991–92 Club Race Director, **TED BERGERON**, has been "promoted" to one of three positions on the Texas Ski Council Race Committee for 1992–93. My TSC Report in last month's Sitzmarke mentioned the TSC Race Committee's presentation at the August Delegate's Meeting in Austin that proposed amended race rules, which were approved

by a strong majority of TSC Delegates. Just FYI, the proposal's primary component was a handicap system developed solely by our own Ted, who had spent over eight months on his own trying to resolve some inequities of the old system which occasionally put clubs with 30 or 40 racers in a no-win situation against clubs with 100 or more racers. With the new race rules, all clubs, both large and small, will now have a fair chance by competing with clubs of similar size in four divisions instead of three. These race rules will be implemented beginning with the 1992 TSC Fall Roundup at Keystone, where Space City will be competing in Division I.

Also working behind the scenes on TSC Races are SCSC members GARY BUTLER (ATC on Steamboat I) and his brother, CHARLES BUTLER (currently residing in Saudi Arabia). Gary and Charles are both busy working on writing the program for the TSC Race Computer to incorporate the new handicap system created as a result of the new TSC Race Rules. Many thanks for your computer expertise! (P.S. Charles: We hear that Gary is glad he could give you a project to help fill your spare time in Saudi!)

And on yet another TSC race project, currently being adapted by the TSC Race Committee for use in connection with future TSC Club Races is our own SCSC Race Director's Manual, created by TED BERGERON in 1991. Since Ted authored the original version of the Race Manual and also developed the aforementioned TSC handicap system, another TSC Race Committee member has been assigned the responsibility of modifying the Training Manual for use by the TSC. Ted, take a much deserved rest, like that long-awaited European vacation!!






