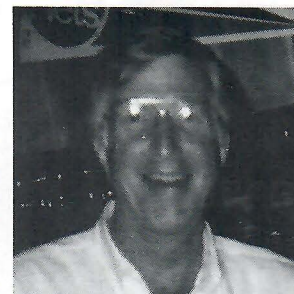
**OH NO!!!**

## From the Ski Desk...

It's hard to believe, but this is the next to the last article I will be writing as VP of Trips for SCSC. In reflecting over this past year there are several issues I would like to generally discuss with the overall membership of SCSC regarding ski trips. So.... Here goes. I have this month and next!!!!

I have asked for constructive feedback from TCs, ATCs, past officers, etc. to help me evaluate the efficiency of performing the "job" of the TC and ATC. I have received input; however, not necessarily in the form of suggestions about how to SOLVE problems. It seems people have complaints, but they either don't voice them or don't offer a better (realistic) approach to doing things. I say "realistic" because changes in an organization this size don't happen overnight. Please know that I welcome your comments and suggestions. My goal now as a "lame duck" is to help the incoming VP of Trips learn from my mistakes as well as my successes and to help this person with a smooth transition.

The first question I would like to pose to each of you is "What do you expect from a TC and an ATC?" Let me add that the duties of a TC and ATC are to organize the transportation to and from the airport, find lodging, arrange for the purchase of lift tickets, research transportation to/from the ski area and lodging location and arrange for buses if no shuttle service is available. In addition, the TC and ATC host several SCSC parties during the trip which can range from continental breakfasts to happy hours to dinners, whichever they so desire. I feel very honored to have received a two page typed letter from

one TC who cares enough about this club to give me some honest input. I will quote a portion of this letter: "From the scuttlebut around the Ski Club, I know some people were very unhappy with their trips - for whatever reason. You can't please them all. Some of these people have come to believe that these are totally CATERED trips. We've done this to ourselves. Too many TCs/ATCs have gone overboard to make their trip the best ever. This has set prececents for following trips and some of our current TCs and ATCs just can't live up to that. We're all working people who have OTHER "jobs" and do not necessarily have unlimited time available. SCSC has become the SKI CLUB HILTON, and TCs are expected to cater to every whim. We've begun doing too much and now it is EXPECTED."

As a VOLUNTEER organization, I ask each of you to think about how you filled out your trip critique forms for this year's trip. When you rated your TC and ATC, what was your basis of comparison? If you rated people poorly (or less favorably), are YOU willing to volunteer and run a trip yourself? Do you really know how much time and effort TCs and ATCs spend putting a trip together? Do you realize that the TCs and ATCs are not travel agents? Yes, we do have a contract with Atlas Travel but only for TICKETING the airfare. The TCs and ATCs do all the "leg work". Sometimes all a trip participant sees is what a TC and ATC do when they are on the trip. Volunteers have different personalities. Some TCs/ATCs may be hard core skiers and need their sleep. Some may be partiers and hit the slopes at noon so they'll be at the mountain for the next happy hour. Some may be a combination of both. All I ask is that you ask yourself if you EXPECT a travel agent to run

your trip or if you APPRECIATE everything a volunteer has done to put your trip together so all you have to do is show up at the airport. Heard enough???? Just food for thought... THANKS FOR ALL YOUR HARD WORK, VOLUNTEERS.

Congratulations to ALL the nominees for offices for next year. I am very proud of my two DoTs (Jim and Nancy) who are willing to move forward in the club as officers. From my experience with them, I know they will be very dedicated and hard workers. I am also very pleased to see that two of this year's TCs were nominated (Sharon and Gary). It's GREAT to see this kind of enthusiasm in our club. Remember, there are still two DoTs and a Race Director that the incoming VP of Trips must select. Please let your interest be known.

I regret to inform you that the Snowbird/Alta trip has been cancelled. This one is still a mystery to me. The snow there is usually the best late in the season, and with ski in/ski out accomodations I am really surprised about the lack of interest. Think about this trip for next year, because we will try again so SCSC doesn't lose all of their deposit. It's really a great place to ski, and I know Robert and Charlotte did a lot of work planning it. Sorry it didn't work guys. Wait 'til next year!

If any of you are interested in a trip to New Zealand, Clear Lake Ski Club is running one July 15-31, 1994 (around \$2,000). For more info call Dave Copous, TC (470-7838) or Rick Weller, ATC (488-2802). \*

# RACEY NEWS

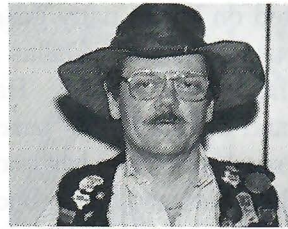
SNOWMASS, COLORADO. Not so good news is we took second place in Division I losing to Los Amigos by 646 unadjusted points. Good news is we still lead the Division by one point. Remaining are the Winter Shootout at Banff and the Final Showdown at Jackson Hole both of which look good for us. Weather at Snowmass was FUNTASTIC!!! On race day it was 28° F., sunny and no wind. We raced on two dual slaloms and all would have gone well had our starting time not been delayed 1-1/2 hours by a faulty-timing device. Thanks to our sharp eyed Race Directors **JOHN JACOB** and **JOHN WEBER** silver medal winner **FRANK MANGUM** was nearly counted as a no show! Albeit one silver credit was recovered we still lost first place to Los Amigos by the equivalent of 17 silver medals!!!

We registered 135 racers, 111 started, 106 finished, 5 DQet, 0 fell and 24 no showed!!! We scored 2,426 unadjusted TSC points with a 0 handicap to Los Amigos unadjusted 3,072 points...unadjusted meaning raw score. With a 6% HC Los Amigos racked up 3,256 adjusted points. On average Los Amigos 121 racers scored 25.3 TSC points to our 22.9....meaning they out manned and out raced us per racer. Our only gold in the club race went to **Harry Gaston**. In the Nastar Division our fastest man was **Ed Cain** who if he can't beat the clock likes to take it out! See Ed for details. Fastest woman was **CHERYL (SLICK) HOUGE**. In the Challenger Division - fastest man was **DARRELL (NO) WAY** and fastest woman was **LINDA RICE**...missed bronze by one point.

In the Individual Races fastest man was **NELSON (NO HAIR) TURNER** who thought his skis and technique were smoother. Fastest woman was... surprise!... **CHERYL (NO RESISTANCE) HOUGE**... ho hum. Fastest Senior man was... alas!... **HARRY (TWICE GOLD) GASTON** who was undoubtedly after the aforementioned fastest woman...what a foxy OFOS! Fastest Senior woman was none other than our very own **LOTTY GAUTSCHI**...good show!

Now a little number crunching. Out of 106 races, 41 were seniors (age 50 for men, 48 for women). Average age for all racers was 48.2 years of age. Average female age was 41.7 and average male age was 52. Average male handicap was 69.7 vs 90.2 for females. Overall HC for all racers was 87.7. The medal count was 1 gold, 7 silver, 26 bronze, 31 black, 13 blue, 8 green and 20 novice. This translates into 34 NASTAR and 72 CHALLENGER MEDALS! Is this fun or 'nuf???

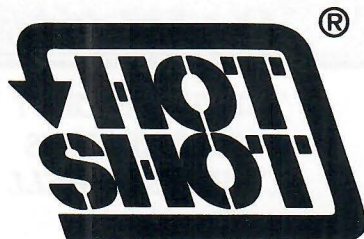

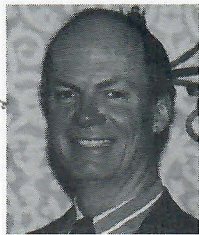

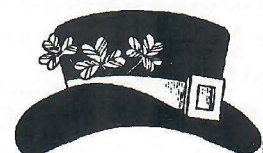

not only sang along with us but also made requests. They were presented with gifts as we went singing throughout

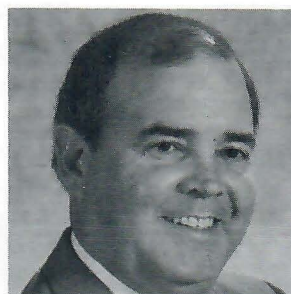


wards on four floors and remaining gifts were left with volunteer staff to be distributed to those whom we could not see.

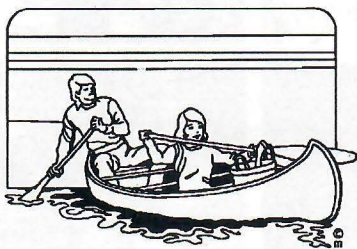

### CORRECTION TO TEXAS SKI COUNCIL REPORT

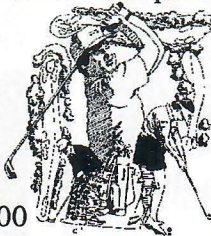
