
FROM THE SKI DESK

ANOTHER SWAN SONG....

The final meeting of the 1990-1991 Texas Ski Council was held April 19-21 in San Antonio. This meeting, called the Bid Meeting, is truly a working weekend as the delegates from the member council clubs listen to the bid presentations by the various ski resorts and vote to decide next year's Texas Ski Council trip locations.

Space City was well represented at this meeting. Joining me this year as Space City delegates were Jerry Montgomery, Alternate Texas Ski Council Representative; Ginger Howard, incoming President; Debbie Bergeron, incoming VP Trips; Ed Cain, incoming VP Membership; Beverly Merritt, incoming VP Publications; and Donna Repka, incoming Secretary. Other SCSCers attending as guests included Ray Naudain, President; Peggy Donley, VP Programs; Craig Tharpe Liebergot, VP Trips; Kim Page, Secretary; Ted Bergeron, Board Member; Sharon Inman, Anita Yeomens, Tom Mercer, Floyd Hanks, Kay Ellig, Howard Pailet, Tom Hogle and Dick Howard.

Major points of discussion on the selection of the resorts included:

- Breckenridge is a welcome change for the Thanksgiving trip. If the early snow is better at other resorts in the area, trip participants can travel to them easily.
- Steamboat was unable to work out a reasonable arrangement with the Sheraton for holding TSC parties in their ballroom. TSC clubs would have had to book 100 units at the hotel in order to use the ballroom and there wasn't any arm waving by clubs wanting to stay in the hotel rooms over condos.
- Winter Park PROMISED to have transportation as their number one priority. Yours truly specifically addressed this issue with the WP respresentatives who said they'll be ready for the SCSC masses. Look for them to appear LIVE and IN-PERSON at SCSC meetings to answer your questions.
- Sugar Loaf Mountain, a very popular resort in northeastern Maine, put together an excellent bid and offered tremendous value for the ski dollar. Look for them to be back!
- Keystone, a favorite of the Texas Ski Council for years, put together excellent bids which highlighted their new mountain, The Outback. The votes were close and Keystone only lost by a goggle. (This was just a test to see if anyone is reading this!)

The Saturday night party certainly kept up the spirit of fun typical of TSC parties. Castriones (confetti-filled, decorated eggs) were the "hit" of the party with former SCSCer Joe Dar, now President of Lone Star Skiers, deserving an award for smashing more eggs on SCSCers than we thought possible. 
SATURDAY IN THE PARK




