NEW PROCEDURE IN SKI TRIP SIGN UP!!! DON'T WAIT UNTIL SEPTEMBER ... SIGN UP IN JULY!!!

Beginning July 1, SCSC members will be able to sign up for trips by mail for the 1990-91 ski season, and what a ski season it will be!!! Early sign up will enable the VP-Trips to maximize the size of the trip. After carefully reviewing the 96 surveys I have received (and after making an INFINITE number of phone calls to arrange lodging and transportation at the best possible prices), the following trip schedule has been put together. Please keep in mind that the schedule is tentative, and the prices are an estimate at this time and subject to change. The official schedule and prices will be updated as necessary in succeeding Sitzmarkes.

NOW...HERE'S HOW TO SIGN UP FOR THESE SUPER TRIPS!!

- 1. Deposits will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis by postmark and cannot be postmarked before July 1, 1990. Complete the Trip Sign-up Form provided in this issue of the *Sitzmarke* and enclose it with your deposit.
- 2. You must have renewed your membership for 1990-1991. No deposits will be accepted without a current membership number for each participant signed up. Membership renewal will be verified.
- 3. A \$100.00 deposit is required for each domestic trip, and \$300.00 for the Courmayer, Italy trip. Your check will be deposited upon receipt.
- 4. Wait lists will not be started until the trip is full.

- 5. If one cancels off a trip, the normal cancellation policy applies (see 5.0 5.4 under "Trip Penalties" of the SCSC Standing Rules).
- 6. Should the final trip price exceed the original estimate by more than \$50.00, you have the option to cancel within 14 days of the new published price, and receive a full refund on your deposits. (EXAMPLE: Vail estimated at \$500.00 budgets out to be \$560.00 or more.)
- 7. Fill out the form and return it to me along with your \$100.00 deposit for each trip (or \$300.00 for Courmayer). Make checks payable to "Space City Ski Club" or "SCSC" and put your membership number and name of trip(s) on the check.

TEXAS SKI COUNCIL MEETING UPDATE

The Texas Ski Council met in San Antonio on April 21-22, 1990, for the annual bid selections for the 1990-91 ski season and the election of officers.

The bid process starts by sending Requests for Bids to all the ski areas. As the bids are received, a pre-bid selection committee reviews all the bids, checking for compliance with TSC bid requirements and selects approximately three to four areas to be presented for each ski week at the actual meeting. The areas selected send representatives from marketing to present their bids and field questions from the delegates of the 21 clubs that make up the Texas Ski Council. The process continues until all the clubs vote and a final slate of trips is selected and voted on. The following areas were awarded the bids:

About twenty people made Keaneally's Irish Pub in time to listen to the Irish band, while outside the








