

### TEXAS SKI COUNCIL REPORT

The Texas Ski Council met on August 25, 1990, in Austin. One new club from Abilene was admitted to the Council. The Renegades from Dallas have reorganized and were re-admitted to the Council after a one-year absence. Cowtown Ski Club from Fort Worth has resigned from the Council and SCSC will certainly miss them in the competition for the Texas Ski Cup. The Houstonian Snow Skiers were not approved for membership in the Council this year, given their financial difficulties. We hope their members can participate on Council trips through the other Houston ski clubs.

The Council has once again secured sponsorship from World Wide Ski which brings us sponsors such as Lite Beer, Raichle, Tyrolia, Obermeyer, Bonne Bell, The Wax Stick and Thor-Lo Padds. The Council has also secured sponsorship from Oshman's, who will offer a 10% discount to club members on all non-sale merchandise and a 50% discount off ski shop work and deck lessons.

On another note, the Council is experiencing some financial difficulties and a committee was created to investigate the advisability of the Council changing to a profit organization. This important issue will be decided at the December meeting.

The Council had updates on the upcoming trips to Vail and Snowmass. Everything is going fine and all of the Council trips should be a great success! There was also discussion about replacing the European trip for the 1991-92 season with a trip to South America. Watch for more information on this idea next year and let our VP-Trips, Craig Tharpe, know if you would be interested in participating on a trip "south of the border."

Final discussion was held on the Council Race Rules for this ski season. We should have the latest version of the rules shortly and will pass them on to our Race Directors. Good Luck to our racers on the Thanksgiving trip!

The next Texas Ski Council meeting will be held in Houston in December.



We will be leaving Sunday, February 3 on United Air lines and returning February 10. We will be staying at one of the Sun Valley condominium properties, located in the core of the village.






