This is the time that every year sees 1,000 + ski-all-day and party-allnight Texans descend on some lucky ski resort that actually bids for the opportunity of having all the craziness of Traditional Texas Ski Week in their area. One hundred ninety-two SCSCers will participate in Tradition this month at Steamboat Springs. (Actually, by the time that you read this, they'll be ready to come home.) Every year this Texas Ski Council sponsored trip continues to grow in popularity and in recent years has been the biggest airlift SCSC does to any area. NASTAR - What Does It Mean to the Beginning Skier?

Many beginning and intermediate skiers unfortunately avoid participation in NASTAR because of fear or shyness. The NASTAR experience instead, is a helpful learning tool for any skier who has completed his/her fundamentals and can perform the basics. Many of us, myself included, think of NASTAR as racing and picture olympic skiers in our mind's eye which brings visions of speed and danger. This is not true. The course is normally layed out on an easy intermediate hill and can be completed by almost any skier who can accomplish a wedge turn.

Scoring is based upon a "standard." This standard is based on how the local pro's speed of the day relates to his peer group; then based on the skier's age and sex, your score is handicapped. This score, even if not worthy of a medal, can give a benchmark to a skier's progress. One of the truly meaningful experiences is improving your score with the eventual hope of a medal. It can be great fun to

compare times with members of your ski class.

The best advice for your first time down is not to go as fast as possible, but instead to complete the course and thus have a feel for it -- a second run is allowed for a nominal fee when you can "go for it".


Most ski areas run NASTAR races two or three days a week. Remember to sign up in the morning, normally in the main ticket sales area. The race itself starts around noon. After your run is completed, you are notified of your time which can then be correlated with your handicap to see if a medal is awarded.

Check with your trip chairperson for complete information relating to each individual area for race locations and times. I again encourage every person to try NASTAR skiing for fun as well as instruction. Additionally, instruction comes if the area, as most do, videotape the races for viewing apres ski at some local watering hole after the lifts close.

EXAMPLE: You are a male 25 years old. Your area pacesetter skis the course and establishes a par time of 34 seconds. You ski the course in 39 seconds. By dividing your time by par time, you can see that you skied the course 15% slower than the pacesetter. Finding your age group on the chart and following the line over the 0-15% category male, you see you have won a gold medal.



EXERCISE:RX for JET LAG

To help ward off stress and stiffness from hours of sitting during a flight, try this sampling of isometric exercises developed for World Airways by doctors at the Sports Medicine Center of Capitol Hill Hospital, Washington, D.C. For maximum effect, repeat the exercises every two hours.

- Neck and upper back muscles: Sit up straight in your seat with both feet flat on the floor. Press your head firmly against the seat for five counts, then relax. Now face right, press back, relax; repeat for the left side. Continue several times until muscles begin to warm up.
- Chest muscles: Begin this variation of the familiar "bust developer" exercise by sitting straight, feet flat on the floor, palms together. Cross your thumbs and keep elbows about 12 inches apart. Press your palms together hard for five counts, than relax. Adjust the position of your arms until you feel your chest muscles respond. Press and relax four or five times.
- Abdomen and lower back muscles: While sitting up straight and breathing deeply, your hands in a relaxed position in your lap, slowly tighten and flatten your tummy for five counts, then relax. Repeat four times.
- Buttocks: Relax arms at your sides, but sit up straight with feet flat on the floor. Squeeze your buttocks together and hold for a count of five, then relax. Repeat four times.




