





Both Roy Caviness and Dan Mauk posted 42x50 for the two rounds. It was neck and neck all the way with both posting 22x25 the first round and 20x25 the second round.

The tie allowed **Ken Moredock** to take second with 37x50. Third place was another tie between **Dick (Devil) Bryant** and **Dean Patschke**, both with 34x50.

Participants appreciated a skeet instruction class before the shoot conducted by Bill Pool who is manager of the Gun Club and a professional instructor. During the first round, Bill gave individual instruction to shooters on one field, while John Warner, President of the Greater Houston Gun Club and a top gun, gave individual instruction on the other field.

Women shooters were led by Catherine Long with 25x50. Sue Bohnert came in second with 13x50, followed closely by Betty Donahugh with 12x50 for third.

Another first-time skeet shooter, Ted Bergeron, showed us that a real hunter fits right in with rounds of 13x25 and 11x25.


An individual contest evolved when Ted, shooting with **Pete Meaden**





To those of you who volunteered for TC or ATC and were not chosen, don't give up the ship. You're still on my list as an alternate in case someone who was chosen is unable to complete his or her term. Your names were also given to Lynn Eaton, VP of Programs; if you're interested in running an activity, call Lynn. She has plenty of activities on the calendar for the upcoming year that still need volunteers.

I am very pleased with the air fares and schedules we have secured for this season. Getting SCSC's trip schedule into the airlines early has enabled us to block seats on the same flights. I am still trying to get all of our Steamboat group on the same flight -- we're almost there. If we don't make it, I can at least say we gave it our best shot.

The September sign-up meeting will be upon us before we know it, so start thinking now about where you want to ski. See you next month - same Sitz time - same Sitz Channel!




