



A Word About Negotiating With The Airlines....

Well, it is the time of year that strikes terror in the heart of your VP of Trips. Trying to understand the thinking of the airlines is truly a hair-pulling experience. After having spent numerous hours in discussions with airline representatives, I feel that I know the basic issues and I want to share these with you.

First of all, GROUPS (this means SCSC) are not a priority with the airlines today. With the advent of deregulation and cheap fares, the airlines effectively offer "group rates" every day. Additionally, the airlines have different fares on each seat on the airplane, i.e. 10% First Class, 80% regular fare, 5% reduced fare and maybe 5% special fare (offered as a large promotion to compete with another carrier). What SCSC tries to do, of course, is to get the lowest fares possible and then couple the "cheap seats" with the most advantageous flight times. As one airline Representative said to me, "Pam, would you give away your product at 50% if you knew that you could sell this product to someone else at full price?" Of course not! The carriers that offer the lowest fares are not having problems filling their planes, ergo, why negotiate?

So then we thought, "Well, how about chartering a plane?" According to Continental, "If we own the plane, we're flying it. We don't have them sitting in hangers." Additionally, with every charter you have the problem of flying the plane from point A to point B. At point B you either have a group

waiting to go back to point A or you pay to fly the plane back to point A empty. There went all the money we saved on the charter. (We have the same problem coming back--fly the plane empty to point B to pick us up and then return to point A.)

The other problem we have to consider is that many travel agencies reserve seats on the flights that we want as early as we do. So when we call the airline to reserve 42 seats, or 84, or whatever, we may find that there are only 38 seats on one flight, 56 on another, etc. This is where the compromise on flight times comes into play.

So please bear with me. I can assure you that every volunteer that has held this office has undergone the same torture and criticism from the membership. "Why did you do that???" Unfortunately, more often than not, it was the best compromise that could be negotiated. I truly wish it was as simple as many of you have experienced when you make your individual reservations. Working with the group desk at the airline certainly has its disadvantages. But, I'm doing my best to get as many of us to the slopes as possible at the lowest fares and when we want to be there.

Now, in case you're wondering about our mysterious masked marauder, it is none other than the "SCSC Air Pirate," Ray Naudain. Ray has been seen fencing fiercely with the airlines to protect the interests of SCSCers. We'll continue the saga....
