sibility to get the check to them in time. Your TC has no choice but to scratch you from the list and start calling the people on the waiting list if your final payment check is not received. The Fall Roundup trip to Copper is the first trip of the Texas Ski Cup Challenge Series. I encourage all participants to sign up for the NASTAR club races. The course typically is on a smooth average ski run and skiable by anyone who has ever been on skis before. The clubs of the Texas Ski Council race against each other for points, so when you go across the finish line (standing up I hope!), it gives us a point. Sure would be great to see the Texas Ski Cup return to Space City at the end of this ski season.







BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

At the September 20, 1987 meeting of the Board of Directors, the following changes of the Standing Rules were approved, to take effect immediately:

STANDING RULE 1.0 DUES.

Dues shall be \$25 per single person and \$35 per married couple. Members who renew their current membership prior to June 1, will receive a \$5 discount per membership. Dues are non-refundable, may not be pro-rated, and may not be converted to couple status during the membership year.

STANDING RULE 5.3 TRIP PENALTIES.

A charge of \$5 will be assessed for each trip transfer made prior to final payment date. A transfer will not be considered after final payment date unless a replacement can be secured.

STANDING RULE 7.5 RESTRIC-TIONS.

No person may participate in a Club sponsored trip, or participant paid activity, without first completing a written and signed Release of Liability for that trip or activity, on a form approved by the Board of Directors.

STANDING RULE 8.1 MISCELLANEOUS.

September General Meeting Ski Trip Sign-Up.


- A. No member shall be allowed to sign up for any ski trip prior to the September General Meeting.
- B. Each member may sign up for him/herself and one other person on any regular non-family ski trip.

STANDING RULE 10.4 VICE PRESIDENT-MEMBERSHIP.

B & C are consolidated as follows: Process membership applications and submit these applications to the Executive Committee for acceptance. Upon acceptance, issue Membership Cards.






