




NEWS FROM THE SKI DESK LINEUP SKI SEASON 1986-87

Although apprehensive of the weather, which had been severe in the San Antonio area earlier in the week, 68 people (41 women) showed up at the Metro Park & Ride at I-10 and West Belt Friday, June 6. Three vans and a bus departed at 7:00 o'clock for Camp Huaco Springs for a weekend of rafting, tubing, and companionship. As we watched the panorama of lightning, Hoagies, chips, and Oreos were consumed along with cases of cold drinks.

We were met by Texas River Expedition's owner, John Lohrman, whom everyone calls Kotter, and his guides who trailered our tents, duffle bags, sleeping bags, and other necessary camping gear up the hill to our campsite. With the experienced help of TRE and scores of flashlights, we managed to set up a variety of tents. The lightning bugs provided a twinkling light display, too. We slowly drifted off to sleep listening to the tranquil night sounds of the countryside and enjoying the cool breeze blowing through the tents.

Saturday morning a breakfast of scrambled eggs, sausage patties, English muffins, warm bananas sliced in a brown sugar sauce, coffee and juice was heartily enjoyed. We changed to suitable rafting clothes and boarded the three vans which TRE used to shuttle us up the river to our rafts. We listened intently while Kotter gave a demonstration on what and what not to do while on the river. We donned our life jackets, grabbed our oars, smeared ourselves with sunscreen, and climbed aboard. The river was running at 780 cfs and the water was higher than last year's trip, but not as cold. The water fights started almost immediately (each raft is equipped with a plastic 5-gallon bucket) and continued until we broke for lunch. We sloshed up the hill to our campsite for our lunch break. Huge quantities of fried chicken and watermelon were waiting for our weary group. After a brief rest, we headed back again for the serious part of our rafting trip, Huaco and Slumber Falls. Kotter sensibly issued orders that there were to be NO WATER FIGHTS unless the sun was out. The sun obliged by peeking out every so often so we could cool off and warm up again. We maneuvered the white water with practiced skill and excited squeals.





Take out was late in the afternoon. We were shuttled back to camp for showers, dry clothes and "Happy Hour." Fifteen gallons of Mary's Rigamaritas were consumed along with hors d'oeuvres which were continually appearing. Our "Happy Hour" went well into three hours as TRE was preparing another delicious meal of shish kabobs, cole slaw, fettucini Alfredo, and strawberry shortcake. Soon after, the effects of sun, water, food, and margaritas began to take its toll. The majority wandered back to their tents and were soon asleep. A group of 16 left in the vans for kikker dancing in Gruen and returned around 2:00 a.m.

Our last breakfast consisting of pancakes, bacon, cantalope, and coffee was eaten at a leisurely pace.

We broke camp and loaded two vans which headed back to Houston with 17 Rocket fans. The remaining van and bus headed to New Braunfels for three hours of tubing at Prince Solms Park on the Comal River. Long tube trains were formed which went through the chute frontwards and backwards. We rested on the hillside sitting comfortably in/on our tubes sipping cold drinks and listening to the Rocket game. After a few more tube runs, we changed into dry clothes and boarded our vehicles for our threehour drive back to Houston. Schlotsky's delivered hot sandwiches, plates, and napkins to our bus, which we ate with chips, cold drinks and more Oreos. Silently two-thirds of the bus drifted off for naps. We finally caught up to the rain about 30 minutes outside of Houston, but it stopped while we unloaded the bus and van.

I want to thank all those who participated on the trip and a special thanks to my husband, **Ron Rambin**, whose moral support and helpfulness made my job easier. **Becky Hall**, who successfully ran last year's trip, gave me invaluable suggestions and was a great help planning the budget. I have already thanked The One responsible for our wonderful weather. Texas River Expedition once again did an outstanding job of providing our club with an exciting, fun-filled, and safe weekend.




