
The Steering Committee has selected November 6 for the event with the U.S. Ski Team. They are asking for \$300 per couple to underwrite the cost.





• **BECOME INFORMED ABOUT THE TRIP BEFORE YOU SIGN UP**

Ask Liftliner if you are in the right line for the trip you want to sign up for. Read information concerning trips in Sitzmarke Schedule in September issue. Read trip handout information sheet. Ask Trip

• HIT THE EARLY TRIPS FIRST

Then go sign up for later trips if signing up for more than two trips.

• BE READY TO SIGN UP

Deposit-check ready - note name of trip and your membership number on check. Fill out your Deposit and Release Form completely and sign both places.

CAN'T MAKE THE MEETING

A friend can sign up for you. Each member can sign up ONE other member for a trip. Contact your TC after the meeting - you can sign up via the mail. ALL in ALL, just be patient. The TC will be very busy and will try to take care of everybody. Try to keep in straight lines and do not cut in line. If going for a drink or whatever, tell the person to hold your place - not too long, though, you may lose your place.


