



Ski Trip Sign-Up

Arrive early and wear comfortable shoes.

- There will be no long lines at Stouffers this year because the Club meetings are at the Radisson - remember!
- Doors open at 7:30 p.m.
- While waiting, a bar will be available (yeah!) plus information and membership tables.

You must be a Club Member to participate on a ski trip.

- If you haven't renewed, you can do so at the September meeting.
- Want to become a member? You can sign up for membership while you wait.

Bring your checkbook. A \$75 deposit is required for each trip. Keep your balance up - your check will be deposited that night.

Know the rules.

- Become familiar with the Club's Standing Rules regarding trip penalties, cancellations, transfers, etc. They are listed in your directory.
- The Applicable Standing Rules are also printed on the Deposit and Trip Release Form you will be asked to sign for each trip.

Become informed about the trips before you sign up.

- The particulars of each trip are listed on the 1984-85 Trip Schedule in this issue.
- Read the trip preview articles, also in this Sitzmarke issue.
- Each trip will have a trip information sheet at the sign up table -- it should answer most of your questions.
- An information table will be available in the waiting area.
- Ask questions. The TC and ATC are the most knowledgeable. The liftliner serving each trip table may also be a good source of information.

Hit the more popular trips first if signing up for more than one trip.

Still need help? Ask an officer or a liftliner. They will be most happy to assist you.

Help your TC and ATC assure a smooth sign up.

- Have your deposit check (\$75

 payable to "SCSC") ready. Note
 the trip name and your member
 ship number on the check.
- Have your membership card with you and show it to the TC.






