Each year since 1973 our club has been a part of the Texas sk which is an organization comprised of 18 Texas ski clubs devoted to, you guessed it, skiing. Each y spring the counsel holds a meeting where various ski areas present proposals to the counsel for propackaged ski trips. After listening to the proposals each club's representatives meet and decide wh proposal for a given area to support. That occurs all day Saturday. Then on Sunday morning a vote to determine which trips will be selected. Each club has a different number of votes depending on t the club. Next ski season the counsel trips picked are as follows: We will go to Keystone Colorado, 20th. to 25th., Vail, Colorado January 5th. through the 12th. Banksco, Bulgaria January 25 through 3rd., Telluride, Colorado February 2nd. through the 9th. and finally Quebec, Canada March 1st. thr 8th.. In the coming months I will tell you more about each of the areas and why they were chosen In addition to the Counsel trips we will have about the same number of club trips the destinations ( are being determined as we speak and should be announced in the next Sitzmark. Although the Co destinations are written in stone, the club trips are not. So, where would you like to go? Let me he you at the E-mail address below.
