



# SECOND ANNUAL FUN RUN

The sun's early morning light produced a golden glow behind the fog-filled trees, gaining intensity each moment leading to the 9:15 A.M. start. It created the effect of an impending cataclysm.

A few yards in front of Bear Creek Park's shelter No. 5 a horde of 25 runners paced about as if practicing a final primitive rite before doomsday. As a few minutes after 9:00 A.M. the "bong" turned the nervous prow of the runners into a dash from the starting line.

In the 5K event Fred Kinnat had an early lead which would have given him a victory if he had not taken a wrong turn. "Wrong Way Kinnat" came in third after both Sy Liebergot and Mike Rooney had crossed the finish line in 24:24 and 24:30, respectively. The women's 5K champ was Laura Gangluff, followed by Diane Skore in second place and Margaret McDonald in third.

In the walk-a-beer-can race Bob Marwin received first place honors after starting the race 10 minutes ahead

of 2nd place finisher Shirley Andries. Karen Craig took third place.





# TEXAS SKI COUNCIL MEETING

by Sy Liebergot, TSC Director

The Texas Ski Council (TSC) Board of Delegates (BOD) met in San Antonio on February 27 and 28, 1983 to select the winning ski area bids for the sites of the 1983-1984 ski season TSC sponsored trips.

Earlier in February, fifteen bid responses were evaluated by a BOD pre-selection committee utilizing a weighted scoring system and reduced to seven competitive areas for each of the five requested dates (not necessarily the same seven for each date). The final selections are:

Keystone, Colorado.....Nov. 23-27, 1983

(Thanksgiving)

Sun Valley, Idaho.....Jan. 8-15, 1984

(Texas Ski Week)

Crested Butte, Colorado.....Feb. 12-19, 1984


Heavenly Valley, California.. March 11-18, 1984

Breckenridge, Colorado. March 25-April 1, 1984

The Sun Valley bid was especially attractive in that the area will underwrite the cost of all Texas Ski Week activities (eliminating an activity fee), provide free bus transportation from Salt Lake City to Sun Valley and subsidize some of the bus expenses for clubs busing directly to the area. The 1984 TSW promises to be one of the best ski values in years.

## 1983 Texas Ski Week

In a nutshell, a record-breaking total of 1941 people attended the week of which 1741 participated in the Texas Ski Cup race (over a 3-day period); gross income to the ski area was approximately \$1.25 million. The Texas Ski Cup was stolen early in the week, to be returned extremely damaged by Awards night. Bob Beatty, Director of World Wide Ski Corp. (that owns NASTAR), at the last minute refused to allow NASTAR certification of the Texas Ski Cup race due to the conflict arising from having Miller beer as the

NASTAR sponsor and Coors beer the TSC sponsor. Since no NASTAR medals were permitted to be awarded, TSC will create its own "TEXSTAR" race medals, hopefully to be available at the May meeting.

## Texas Ski Cup

In an effort to increase club participation in all TSC sponsored trips and enhance the opportunity for smaller clubs to win the Texas Ski Cup, the BOD voted to make the Texas Ski Cup a season trophy. Beginning with the 1983-84 ski season, the Texas Ski

Cup will be awarded to the club that accumulates the most club race points during all TSC sponsored trips in a given ski season. Easy Thayer (SCSC), past TSC V.P.- Texas Ski Week, was selected to chair a committee to develop an equitable scoring system for this purpose. A long-range goal of TSC will be to elevate all TSC trips to the status of Texas Ski Weeks with equal emphasis on activities for each trip.

## Satellite Trips

Copper Mountain TSC Trip Coordinator Janet Pickell (SCSC) reported that the trip hosted 220 people from seven clubs. The Club race results had SCSC third behind the HOTS and Armadillo clubs. SCSCer Betsy Romere took second best individual woman skier honors.


## United States Ski Association (U.S.S.A.)

Bob Olsen (SCSC), TSC U.S.S.A. representative, reported U.S.S.A.'s continued interest in TSC and solicitation of TSC's support. U.S.S.A. President Bob McArthur has expressed a desire to hold a meeting with TSC, Flatland Ski Association, and Black Summit. A resolution to support the U.S.S.A. was approved by the BOD.

## Elections

Coyle Buhler, TSC President, reminded the BOD that election of TSC officers for 1983-84 will be held at the May meeting (May 7 in Austin) and to this end a nominating committee has been selected. The committee members are Chairman David Glass (Cowtown), Bob Olsen (SCSC) and Jerry Reno (Alpine).

After two days, the meeting was adjourned to the San Antonio River Walk.
