



Congratulations to our new Officers who will begin their term of office on May 1. Space City Ski Club is indeed unique in that we have so many capable people who are willing to give so much of their time and talent. I know we can look forward to a successful year. Let me urge all of you to attend the April meeting. Appearing elsewhere in this issue are proposed By-Law Amendments which will be submitted to the vote of the membership at the regular meeting to be held April 14, 1982.

Article III, Section 6 of the By-Laws currently limits membership of the Club to 1,400 members. It is proposed that we may accept individuals as members after the 1,400 limit has been reached for that year only if they participate on a SCSC ski trip. In turn, this proposed amendment would promote membership in Space City Ski Club by skiers; we would receive revenue from dues which would otherwise go to another Texas Ski Council member club; and, it would clarify the right of SCSC skiers to race with and for Space City Ski Club at Texas Ski Council sponsored events.

Article III, Section 7 pertains to the membership renewal. Currently, membership renewal shall be by August 1. The proposed amendment would



provide for membership renewals from May 1 through May 31, thus decreasing the "grace period" from four months to one month. Additionally, this proposal would allow for the membership term to coincide with the April 30 fiscal year of the Club; it would ease the Club's cash flow by providing the bulk of funds **before** lodging and airfare deposits are due; and, it would provide for a shorter period to determine who are and are not renewing their memberships. If passed, this proposed change will not take effect until April 30, 1983.

There is one other area of major concern. Over the past few years, costs have been rapidly escalating. The Club has been able to hold its dues stable over the last seven years through some artful management. However, with operating costs (printing, postage, etc.) increasing each year, we find ourselves in a position of not being able to cover these costs with our major sources of income - dues and advertising. Consequently, at the Board of Directors meeting on March 11, 1982, a resolution to amend the Standing Rules on Dues was adopted, increasing dues beginning with the 1982-83 season. It reads that "Dues shall be \$20.00 per single person and \$30.00 per married couple. A \$5.00 processing fee will be charged on all new applications or those received after the deadline set in Article III, Section 7 of the By-Laws." Even with this dues increase, SCSC membership is about the best buy in the market. For these bucks, where else can you receive an excellent monthly publication, join in inexpensive activities throughout the year, make new friends (or enemies) and share a common interest - skiing?

This article is my last as President of the Club. (*No cheers, please*). It has been a pleasure for me and my fellow officers to serve you. I would like to extend a special thanks to the current, Officers for their dedication and continued enthusiasm. I'm looking forward to turning over the gavel at the May meeting to your new President, **Bruce Maughs.**

Mornings start early on the first day of a ski trip, especially when you start in Galveston. 

around the mountain. Len and Joyce, Diane, Kelly, Hugh, Cecil and Charles made Beaver Creek their regular ski mountain.



And to all SCSC'ers — always remember — someday, somewhere, when you least expect it, **Janice Jamail** may come up to you and say, "Shoo-




ABOVE: Silver Medals: Ray Naudain, Jim Plummer and Ken Arty. BELOW: John Mac-Donald and Sy Liebergot.


PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

ARTICLE III: Membership: Section 6, first sentence proposed to be amended to read:
