



# **Report from Texas Ski Council**

The Annual Meeting of the Texas Ski Council (TSC) was held in Austin on May 8th. Thirteen of the statewide member clubs that comprise the TSC Board of Delegates (BOD) were represented at the quarterly meeting. Linda MacFarland Simpson, Anne Benefield, Eric Holm, Steve Gucker, Tania Andrasko and Janet Pickell were in attendance from SCSC.

A proposed budget for 1982-83 was approved that included a slight dues increase. After much discussion, the Membership by-law requiring a club to participate in one TSC sponsored trip each year was changed to two trips, with the BOD empowered to grant exceptions.

Satellite Trip reports were given by the TSC trip coordinators of the Winter Park and Park City trips. The final participation status of the three 1981-82 Satellite trips was: Aspen -210, Winter park - 68, and Park City -168. All three rips were run as "mini" Texas Ski Weeks, with activities and races with trophies. The Winter Park trip had local Miller Beer sponsorship and Park City enjoyed sponsorship money from the Lone Star Brewing Co.

The current participation status of the 1982-83 TSC Satellite Trips was reported and demonstrates a far greater commitment to these joint trips: Keystone - 299, Copper Mountain - 212, Purgatory - 336, and Sun Valley - 229. SCSC has included all four Satellite Trips in its tentative 1982-83 ski trip schedule. Additionally, a candiate list of TSC trip coordinators for these Satellite Trips was approved.

The 1983 Texas Ski Week to Snowmass already has an initial participation of 1160. The Aspen Skiing Company Marketing Director, Sherry Moore, was present and among other activity details, agreed to a \$10 per participant activity fee, identical to the 1982 Texas Ski Week fee. A tentative schedule of events for Texas Ski Week has been set and potential transportation problems are being attacked and solved. Ms. Moore noted that other groups around the country have heard of TSC's apparent economic clout,

especially the price concessions made to TSC members for Texas Ski Week, and want to know how they must organize to benefit, also. For example, the \$12 per day lift ticket (6 out of 7 days, 3 mountain pass) that will be available to Texas Ski Week participants represents the greatest lift ticket price discount in the ski industry.

A co-sponsorship bid by Continental Airlines for the 1983 Texas Ski Week was conditionally accepted subject to further clarification and acquisition of co-sponsor(s).

It was announced that work has begun on the task to incorporate TSC (Cont. on page 13)
