We will also have our Swap shop, under the direction of Fran Stephenson, so if you have any ski clothing or equipment you want to sell or swap bring it to the next meeting.







### THE RMD - HOW IS IT ORGANIZED?

Second in a Series

The RMD functions under the direction of several volunteer elected officials and two full-time paid directors who administer the day-today activities of the division. The many functions of the organization are subdivided and assigned to several committees who plan and execute the activities. The elected officers are the president; vice presidents of administration, membership and recreation, finance, and competition; and the board of directors. The board of directors (of which Ron Crossman is a member) meets four times annually to determine policy and provide guidance for day-to-day operations of the RMD. In addition to the elected directors, seats on the board are held by the following groups: The past president, ski councils (such as the Texas Ski Council). certified officials, coaches system, ski instructors. and ski patrol.

The executive director is selected by the board of directors and the president, and is vested with sufficient authority to efficiently

supervise, manage and direct all of the affairs of the RMD. The RMD is fortunate to have an excellent manager in Bill Abraham to fill this post. More specifically, the duties of the executive director include preparation of a budget, maintaining financial records, disbursing funds, selection and direction of staff members, representing the RMD at public affairs, negotiation of contracts, and on and on. In other words, he's like your club president, half the vice presidents and treasurer rolled into one and on a larger scale. As an ex-officer of SCSC, I don't envy him his job.

Another full-time position is the Competitions Director who is responsible for the administration of all phases of the competitions program. He performs a coordination function among the many groups required to operate the racing programs of the RMD.

Working with the vice presidents are the various committees and affiliates who are responsible for promotion and management of specific RMD functions. Membership on the committees is appointive. Some of the existing committees and affiliates whose functions are apparent from their titles, are as follows: Membership and recreation, ski touring, public lands, fund raising, alpine, nordic, veterans (racing), olympic planning, and publicity and publications committees and certified officials association and coaches system. The work done by these committees range from establishing policy to chopping wood.

This should give you some idea of the mechanism of the RMD. It is a large organization and each committee may work without contact with others, hence take quite a parochial stance with regard to their own area of endeavor. Any RMD member may be called upon to serve on a committee and I hope that in addition to joining the RMD, some of you will want to take an active part in RMD activities. If you want to join, send the attached application to me or see me at the meeting.

### FROM THE HEAD OF THE LIFT LINE 1971-72

From the time Space City Ski Club was founded in 1964 it has enjoyed a fantastic growth rate and has attracted members not only from Houston, but from all over the state of Texas and even from as far away as Louisiana! Today the club has over 1,000 members and has become a relatively large business (grossing over \$127,000 last year).

However, all this growth has not been achieved without many accompanying problems. Our club as experienced in the past and will continue to experience many growth pains. This year your executive committee has spent a great deal of time, in addition to planning the year's activities, to analyzing the club's operations and providing the organization structure necessary to provide for this present and future growth.

One of the most critical areas needing attention is the financial operation. The club is using basically the same accounting system instituted when the club was first organized. Even though many improvements have been made by previous officers, and some very significant changes for the better have been made this year by Treasurer Dan Sebesta, your officers still feel that these functions are badly in need of review. We also feel that you, the members, are entitled to a detailed financial accounting at the end of each fiscal year which has been audited by impartial, outside sources.

Last month we began working toward this goal. Our records and procedures were reviewed by a Certified Public Accountant who is on the staff of one of

the largest national accounting firms, and who generously donated his time to our club. He gave us several very useful suggestions, the most important being that we immediately set up a 3 to 5 board, made up of non-officers trained in accounting, to both review last year's records and help set up for the club an accounting system which would contain all the necessary controls and procedures. At our last executive committee meeting we set up this audit board as a standing committee which would be appointed by, and report to, the President.


Now we urgently need volunteers to serve on this committee. I would like to ask any of you who are CPA's, have training in accounting, or work for any of the accounting firms to please contact me. This will be a service you can perform for your club which will be greatly appreciated, not only by the club's officers, but by all its members.

### NEW SKI AREA AT PAGOSA OFFERS GREAT INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITY!

Announcement of construction of several ski slopes at 'PAGOSA IN COLORADO' underscores the great investment potential of this beautiful 26,000-acre recreational complex now under development in Colorado by the Eaton International Corporation of Phoenix, Arizona.

Skiers are well aware of the tremendous profits realized by early investors at Aspen and Vail, and with its excellent location and accessibility on U.S. Highway 160, combined with the great variety of additional four-season recreation facilities and activities offered at Pagosa, every index points to the probability that Pagosa would be an even greater investment opportunity than Aspen or Vail.


## ...Guaranteed to make you ski better


