LAKE TAHOE TRIP March 7 - March 14



The committee will present their slate at the March meeting (on the third Tuesday in March). At that time further nominations may be made from the floor.

The elections of officers will be held at the April meeting. No further nominations will be taken from the floor at that meeting. Please refer to the ByLaws in the back of your Roster for the duties and the responsibilities of each office.

FROM THE HEAD OF THE LIFT LINE...

Skiers everywhere will now be able to voice their opinions to a newly formed group -- THE NATIONAL SKIERS ACTION SCSC will represent BOARD. the Southwest on this consumer oriented panel, which is composed of leading skiers, ski club officials, and USSA members from all over the United States. This Board will be a vehicle for two - way communication between the skiing public and the ski industry, and will make specific recommendations and proposals to various segments of th industry based on the skiers' needs and desires.

NSAB held its first meeting recently and covered a wide variety of subjects including ticketing practices and problems, improved communications and travel, better reservations systems, improved safety standards, and more functional equipment and apparel. Aspen Highlands, which has offered its facilities as a test ski area, has agreed to implement during the current ski season the following concepts recommended by the Board:

- 1) An optional coupon book system of ticketing in addition to the daily lift pass. Varying numbers of coupons required at each lift. Ideal for beginners who generally use only base area lifts.
- 2.) An A.M. lift ticket for those leaving for home at midday or who want to spend the afternoon shopping, etc.
- 3.) Require runaway straps on all skis.

- 4.) A system of cutting the corners of lift tickets for unsafe practices to discourage reckless skiers. A second cut means lifting a skiers ticket.
- 5.) Install blow-ups of ski maps at the top of every lift to help orient the skier.
- 6.) Prominently display lift times along with lengths and vertical rise at the base of each major lift.

The Board also made several proposals directed specifically towards skier-oriented airline services. These include the installation of ski racks with locks for short term storage at major ski destination airports, furnishing of ski boot cartons by airlines, and airport reception and information centers for skiers.

NSAB will meet again this spring.

SKI TIPS

A big transition in the progression of ski instruction is moving from the stem turn level to the stem christie and parallel christie. The skier feels confident once he has reached the stem turn level. He can traverse across the hill, turn with a snowplow turn and return to a traverse upon completion of the turn. We call this a steered turn. The skier goes into the fall line already in a controlled steered turn.

The Christie turns are often made out of the fall line. The skier must allow the tails of his skis to skid around in the turn. This is known as "heel thrust" in the American Technique. It is a misleading term, however, as the heels do not thrust. In the French Technique it is known as a "rounded side slip."

There is an exercise that helps a skier get the feel of the skidding of the skis. It is called the traverse-sideslip. Skiing across the hill in a traverse, release the edges with a slight up (or down) motion to unweight the skis. Allow the skis to flatten on the snow by letting the knees roll towards the fall line. The side slip is stopped by resetting the edges. This maneuver gives the skier the feel of the skis slipping, which is essential in parallel skiing.
